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Preparation for the Fast

Why Fast?

Fasting is a spiritual tool God uses to advance his kingdom, change the destiny of nations, spark revival, and bring breakthroughs in people's lives. Every Nation churches and campus ministries begin each year with five days of prayer and fasting to humble ourselves before God, consecrate ourselves to him for the upcoming year, and corporately agree for breakthroughs.

Jesus fasted.

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. **MATTHEW 4:1-2**

And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and a report about him went out through all the surrounding country. **LUKE 4:14**

Jesus knew he was going to need spiritual strength to fulfill his purposes. Fasting makes us spiritually strong and prepares us to do God's work.

Fasting is an act of humility and consecration.

Then I proclaimed a fast there, at the river Ahava, that we might humble ourselves before our God, to seek from him a safe journey for ourselves, our children, and all our goods. **EZRA 8:21**

As we humble ourselves through prayer and fasting, we can receive God's answers to our prayers.

Fasting helps us become sensitive to the Holy Spirit.

While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." **ACTS 13:2**

When we deny ourselves of natural cravings and worldly distractions, we become more sensitive to God's voice, allowing us to better focus on God and submit to his will.

Fasting brings revival.

And your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to dwell in. ISAIAH 58:12

Throughout history, God has brought revival and delivered nations from destruction in response to prayer and fasting. Fasting helps us persevere in prayer and intercession.

Fasting is healthy.

Fasting cleanses your digestive system from toxins. Doctors consider fasting a cure for certain allergies and diseases. The discipline of fasting helps break unhealthy addictions in our lives.

Planning Your Fast

Then Joshua said to the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders among you." JOSHUA 3:5

Pray-Spend time reading the Bible before the fast. Ask the Holy Spirit for guidance in your prayers. On pages 7-9, write down your faith goals and specific prayer requests for your family, friends, church, and nation.

Commit—Pray about the kind of fast you will undertake and commit to it ahead of time. Record your plan on page 5. Ask God for grace to help you follow through with your decisions.

Act—Start eating smaller portions a few days before the fast. Avoid food high in sugar and fat. Plan to limit physical and social activities for the week of the fast. Ask someone to be your prayer partner throughout the fast and have that person sign page 5.

NOTE: Consult a physician, especially if you are pregnant, nursing, or taking medication. Determine what will work best if your situation does not allow you to do a full fast.

While Fasting

[Jesus] answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." MATTHEW 4:4

Focus—Set aside time to work through the devotionals. Be ready to respond to God's Word and the leading of the Holy Spirit.

Pray—Join at least one prayer meeting in your local church. Intercede for your family, church, pastors, nation, campuses, and missions throughout the week.

Replenish—During mealtimes, read the Bible and pray. Drink plenty of water and rest as much as you can. Be ready for temporary bouts of physical weakness and mental annoyances like impatience and irritability.

Breaking the Fast

And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him. 1 JOHN 5:14-15

Eat—Reintroduce solid food gradually. Your body will need time to adjust to a normal diet. Start with fruits, juices, and salad, then add more vegetables. Eat small portions throughout the day.

Pray—Don't stop praying! Trust God's faithfulness and timing. Carry your newfound passion for God throughout the year. Be in faith for God to answer your prayers.

PRAYER

Before we go further, let's start with a simple prayer: "Come Holy Spirit. As I read God's Word and this devotional, show me what You would have me do in response to Your word. In Jesus' name. Amen."

Revelation 7:9

9 After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands.

Additional Reading: John 12:12-13

Have you ever felt as though life is simply passing you by? As if you're just existing without a clear direction? Chasing purpose in a world filled with uncertainty can lead to confusion. As we embark on this week of prayer and fasting, we aim for this devotion to help you explore your purpose. To understand your purpose, it's essential to grasp why you have one in the first place. Why has God crafted a plan for your life? Is it merely to enhance the world? Not quite. Revelation 7:9 paints a picture of our mission: to bring people from all walks of life into communion with the Lord, allowing them to worship Him for eternity.

Isn't that incredible? To experience what Revelation 7:9 describes, the first step is to accept Jesus as Lord and Savior of your life. Through grace, we begin to walk in a manner that enables us to share the redeeming unity of Christ with others. The divisions that once separated us on Earth—nations, tribes, languages—transform as we unite in worship of the Father. Thanks to Jesus' victory on the cross, we are made righteous and can rejoice in the salvation He provides.

Before getting caught up in determining your exact purpose, embrace the salvation He offers by making Him the Lord and Savior of your life. Only then can you fully engage in the mission He calls you to.

REFLECTION

Have you ever felt uncertain about your purpose or direction in life? Embracing the truth of God's mission, as described in Revelation 7:9, can significantly reshape how we view our purpose and daily walk. It's essential to consider the steps we can take to fully accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior in every area of our lives, aligning ourselves with His mission to bring others into redeeming unity through salvation.
APPLICATION Pause to pray the following, and then finish your brayer time by writing down what you believe God is speaking to you today.

REFLECTION

We should actively look for opportunities to engage in conversations about faith and invite others to participate in this meaningful mission.

PRAYER

Matthew 9:35-38

35 Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. 38 Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

Additional Reading: Psalm 2:8

In everything He did, Jesus responded from the depths of His character, particularly His profound compassion for people. Compassion is one of the most commonly used descriptors of His emotional state throughout the Gospels, driving Him to act on behalf of others.

What does compassion feel like? It is a deep sense of love and connection; a recognition of the suffering that exists in our shared human experience. Compassion involves empathy and often compels us to act in support of those who are hurting.

Take a moment to reflect on what evokes compassion within you. Where do you see suffering around you? When do you feel the strongest empathy toward others? Recall moments when you've felt moved to assist those in need. Notice the instances of compassion in your life and jot them down.

Jesus instructs His disciples to pray earnestly. He doesn't tell them to "fix all the suffering immediately" or to "do as much as possible because it all hinges on you." Instead, His directive is simply to pray earnestly. This type of prayer involves sincere and fervent conviction. Just like Jesus acted from a place of compassion, we, too, can pray earnestly fueled by that same compassion.

REFLECTION

Reflect on the list of individuals you've identified. These might be people you know by name or possibly groups you care about. Let's pray that Jesus will send others to relieve their suffering and that they will become part of God's family. May the Holy Spirit fill us with compassion and guide our prayers. If you feel led say your prayer out loud or write it down.	5

Throughout Scripture, especially in the New Testament, we witness a beautiful tapestry of individuals—men and women from diverse backgrounds—who are empowered and sent out to be witnesses of the Gospel Truth. They share the Good News of Jesus across nations, seeing people saved, baptized, and filled with the Holy Spirit. Today, we find ourselves in a similar position, as many answer the call to travel and fulfill the Great Commission in Matthew 28. This calling extends to all of us who are empowered by the Holy Spirit.

But where are we called to go? The answer lies in our everyday lives—at work, at school, in the gym, at the grocery store, or even in the neighborhood park. In today's world, connecting with people from various backgrounds and nationalities has never been easier. We encounter these individuals daily, whether we are aware of it or not, as we go about our routines.

In Acts 13, several people were empowered and filled with the Holy Spirit before embarking on their journeys. We too have been filled with this same Spirit, and it is our responsibility—our privilege—to trust in His guidance as we navigate our communities. The question we must ask ourselves is: Will we listen to the Holy Spirit when He prompts us to share His message with others?

REFLECTION

Consider the various places you visit throughout your
day and the multitude of people you encounter. Each
person presents an opportunity to share the Gospel.
You don't need to travel far; sometimes the nations are
just down the street or in the next cubicle at work.
Who can you reach out to and share the Gospel with
today?

APPLICATION

AFFEICATION
Take a few moments to pray and ask the Holy Spirit to show you someone with whom you can share the Gospel this week. Pray and ask Him for
the words to say. Pray for hearts to be softened and open to what He would say through you. Finish your prayer time by writing down what you believe God is speaking to you today.

As we delve into the Book of Acts, we see the powerful work of the Holy Spirit in and through the lives of the early believers. From the Day of Pentecost to the journeys of Paul and Barnabas, God's Spirit was at the forefront of the mission. Like Paul and Barnabas, we can be led by the Holy Spirit to preach the Gospel, all while being actively engaged in our church community. They returned to Antioch not just to share their triumphs but to uplift and encourage the body of Christ.

Some may believe that their relationship with God is a solitary journey, but Scripture teaches us otherwise. Acts 14:26-27 recounts how Paul and Barnabas returned to their church to share all that God had accomplished through them. The church is a vital place for not only sharing what the Lord has done but also for receiving encouragement in carrying out His call on our lives.

In 1 Corinthians 12, we're reminded that God has equipped each of us with unique gifts and assignments to edify the church. These gifts cannot be fully utilized in isolation. Today's Focus Scripture illustrates how Paul and Barnabas shared their experiences to inspire others within the church to use their own gifts.

No matter our individual gifts, we are called to unify in our mission of reaching people for the Lord and to encourage one another in this task. It is only through the unity of the Holy Spirit that we can accomplish this.

REFLECTION

Let's think about how we can actively contribute to the mission of our church community by utilizing the gifts God has given each of us. What steps can we take to grow in unity with other believers?

6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

Throughout this week, we've been inspired to engage in the mission of sharing the Gospel and making disciples. But a common concern arises: What happens if we fail in this endeavor? The comforting truth is that God's plans do not hinge on our perfection or abilities. Our limitations do not lessen His power to work through us. The Holy Spirit is with us, guiding our steps and equipping us with everything we need.

When we face challenges in our mission, we are encouraged to lean on prayer and community for support. Philippians 1:6 reassures us that He who began a good work in us will carry it to completion. Instead of allowing the fear of failure to paralyze us, we can view these moments as opportunities for growth and deeper reliance on God's grace. No matter the circumstances, He remains faithful, guiding us in love as we invite others into this mission.

So, perhaps we should also ask: What if we succeed in sharing the Gospel? What if people respond with acceptance and join us in following Christ? Imagine the ripple effects—disciples making disciples, impacting our neighborhoods, workplaces, and ultimately the world. We could witness communities transformed by Christ, encouraging one another, sharing experiences, and reflecting God's love in our actions. This would be a powerful demonstration of the Gospel's transformative nature, uniting us in our mission to fulfill the Great Commission with passion and purpose!

REFLECTION

Over the next year—yes, an entire year—let's commit to living out this mission and making a real impact in our community. Start by creating a list of up to 10 people who need to hear the Gospel. Then, focus on two key steps:

1. **Prayer and Accountability**

Dedicate specific times each week for prayer aimed at sharing the Gospel with your list and seeking opportunities to disciple them. Form an accountability group with two or three people to share experiences, pray for one another, and encourage one another in this mission.

2. **Build Relationships and Share**

Invest time in building relationships, initiate meaningful conversations, and invite these individuals to church, a Life Group, or even a simple cup of coffee. Let's not hesitate to share the Gospel and invite them into a relationship with Jesus.

Together, we can embrace our mission and transform our communities fo the glory of God.
